The Land Between the Rivers

• Ancient Greeks called the region between the Tigris and the Euphrates rivers Mesopotamia. Both rivers begin in the Taurus Mountains in Turkey. The rivers deposit silt as they flow south, making the region a good place for farming. Farmers in southern Mesopotamia protected their fields from flooding by building a system of levees. Northern Mesopotamia usually had enough rain to make some farming possible yet the earth was mostly rocky and bad for farming. Farmers in this region had to irrigate their crops.

Successful Farmers


 Mesopotamian farmers grew many different crops. There were fields of wheat and barley. There were also gardens of beans, onions, lettuce, cucumbers, and herbs. Farmers also grew date palm, apple, and pomegranate trees. Shepherds herded sheep and goats for their milk and wool. Cattle were work animals, and produced milk and meat.


