Pose this task to student groups: "Imagine you are in Lauren's, Robbie's or Natalie's writing response group. If Lauren, Robbie or Natalie shared these initial ideas for this writing assignment, what advice would you give them to help them turn their brainstorms into a story that is as detailed as one of the "real rule" stories from Mr. Wisniewski's book."
